Discussion and Possible Action to Approve the First Amendment to the Linking Agreement (CON-25-003-POL) with PFVT Motors, LLC for Purchase of Vehicles Budgeted in Fiscal Year 2026/2027

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve and Authorize the Town Manager to execute the First Amendment to the Linking Agreement with PFVT Motors, LLC (CON-25-003-POL-A1) to purchase eight vehicles in Fiscal Year 2027 in an amount not to exceed \$490,000.

- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase two (2) Ford Police Interceptors.
- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase two (2) Ford F150 Police Super Crew
- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase one (1) Electrical Vehicle Community Development
- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase one (1) Ford Explorer Detective
- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase one (1) Ford Bronco Administration
- Contract No. CTR059322 to purchase one (1) Ford F550 PW Landscape Truck

The eight (8) vehicles will be purchased after July 1, 2026, not to exceed **\$490,000.00**.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Town's Fleet Department is recommending the purchase of eight (8) vehicles, 7 of the vehicles have been identified for replacement due to age, mileage, and mechanical instability and failure and one new electric vehicle to be added to the fleet.

BUDGETARY IMPACT:

The amount required to complete this project is **\$476,851.00** The amount requested in the FY26-27 budget is **\$490,000.00**.

1. Purchase Electric Vehicle: Community Development.

1. The vehicle will be an addition to the fleet

2. Replace: 2018 Chevrolet Tahoe – unit #56 is used by the Police Department for patrol.

- Purchased 2018.
- The vehicle has an odometer reading of 111,480 miles.
- The vehicle is 7 years old.
- (Transmission failed need replaced)

Replace: 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe – unit #60 is used by the Police Department for patrol.

- Purchased 2019.
- The vehicle has an odometer reading of 105,635 miles.
- The vehicle is 8 years old.
- Unit has passed replacement miles and due to age

Replace: 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe – unit #61 is used by the Police Department for patrol.

- Purchased 2020.
- The vehicle has an odometer reading of 99522 miles.
- The vehicle is 6 years old.
- (Engine Failed needs replaced)

Replace: 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe – unit #62, and unit # is used by the Police Department for patrol.

- Purchased 2019.
- The vehicle has an odometer reading of 97,080 miles.
- The vehicle is 7 years old.
- (Engine Failed needs replaced)

Replace: 2017 Toyota Camry – unit 01

- Purchased 2017
- The vehicle has an odometer reading of 98,800 miles.
- The vehicle is 9 years old
- Unit has passed replacement miles and age

Replace: 2014 Chevrolet Equinox unit 08

- Purchased 2014
- The vehicle has an odometer 111,345
- The vehicle is 12 years old
- Vehicle is due to be replaced in FY27
- Unit has passed replacement miles and age

3. Replace: 2014 Ford F550 Landscape Truck for Streets Department

- Purchased 2014
- The vehicle has an odometer of 44,628
- The vehicle is 12 years old
- Unit has passed replacement age

The purchase of these vehicles is contingent upon approval of the FY 26-27 budget. If approved, staff will begin the purchase process immediately at the beginning of the fiscal year as the delivery time of the vehicles could take six months or more. ***This request is for the procurement of vehicles only. This request does not include any vehicle equipment upfitting, which will be procured separately.***

The Town will take advantage of prices quoted to the State through a competitive bid process and purchase the patrol vehicles by using the Arizona State Vehicle Contracts.
