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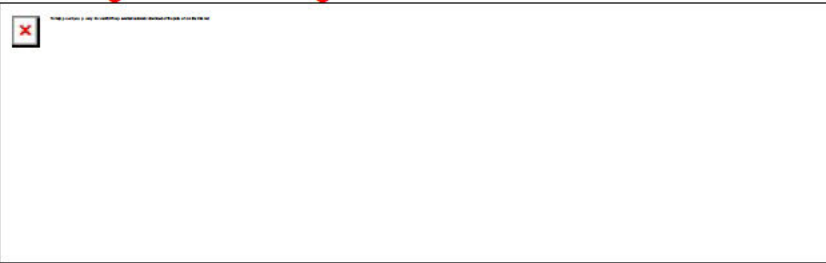

I wish to express my strongest support for relocating the Ascension Lutheran Church Spire to the Town Hall campus. As many of you know, this spire was designed by William Wesley Peters, a protege of Frank Lloyd Wright, and has been a part of the Paradise Valley landscape for some 60 years. As a longtime Arizona resident with 40 years in Paradise Valley, I consider it important to preserve our history.

I recommend that we keep the cross since it will add to the height and has always been part of this particular spire.

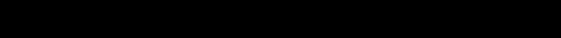


