Four Targeted General Plan Programs

- Public Outreach/Public Education
- Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory
- Sustainable Water

Stakeholders

Given the diverse nature of the community, different targeted approaches to match needs

 - Residents
 - ► Town Corporation
 - Businesses

Regeneration/Trash & Recycling

Projects:

- Assist Town in exploration of issues related to multiple trash haulers
 - Stakeholder: Residents
 - ▶ Implementation program goal: 7.4-1.10
 - Action Steps:
 - ▶ 1. Research impacts of trucks on Town streets and potential to quantify
 - ▶ 2. Survey sample of residents re: position on relevant trash & recycling related issues to assist in development of plan
 - ▶ 3. Evaluate/compare available providers as to recycling capabilities
 - ▶ 4. Aid in education of residents re: what recycling is available with their provider (partner with trash haulers)

Regeneration/Trash & Recycling cont.

- ▶ Town-wide recycling program
 - Stakeholder: Town
 - ▶ Implementation program goal: 7.4-1.10
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Review current recycling programs and processes and best practices (see Capstone 2008)
 - ▶ 2. Provide recommendations for possible improvements
 - ▶ 3. Review prior Waste Audit for recommendations/plans implemented

Public Outreach/ Public Education

Projects:

- Review Town sustainability webpage(s) and provide recommendations
 - Stakeholders: Residents and Businesses
 - ▶ Implementation program goal: 7.4-1.3
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Research on best practices for municipalities sustainability site
 - ▶ 2. Provide recommendations and proposed content
 - ▶ 3. Design template or process for use by future developer or site maintenance

Public Outreach/ Public Education

- ▶ Guest column in Paradise Valley Independent
 - Stakeholder: Residents
 - ▶ Implementation program goals: 7.4-1.3 & 7.4-1.4
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Develop editorial calendar focused on highlighting TPV achievements & other sustainability topics
 - ▶ 2. Seek out potential authors (e.g., residents, TPV staff, business community)

Public Outreach/ Public Education

- Explore interest and opportunity to host a "Green Parade of Homes"
 - Stakeholder: Residents
 - ▶ Implementation program goals: 7.4-1.4 & 7.4-1.5
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Research how/if other municipalities have done something similar and best practices
 - ▶ 2. Meet with Desert Botanical Garden (does garden tour of homes) and others for ideas and experiences
 - ▶ 3. Explore and propose process to select participant and recommend potential sponsors and partners, etc.
 - ▶ 4. Create subcommittee to develop and execute event

Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory

Project:

- Collect and review the completion of GHG emissions inventory for the Town
 - Stakeholder: Town
 - ▶ Implementation program goal: 7.4-1.6
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Research and review any prior inventory prepared (see Capstone 2008)
 - ▶ 2. Work with TPV staff to develop GHG reduction goals
 - ▶ 3. Recommend process to move program forward, establish targets and benchmarks

Sustainable Water

Project:

- Develop water conservation report*
 - ▶ Stakeholders: Residents and Town
 - ▶ Implementation program goal: 7.4-1.8
 - Action steps:
 - ▶ 1. Evaluate TPV water usage
 - ▶ 2. Establish baseline
 - ▶ 3. Recommend strategies for improvement
 - ▶ 4. Develop reporting process and format
