## **History**

- In January 2013, Resolution 1270 created the Public Safety Task Force.
- The PSTF had over 50 citizens participate the creation of the Final report, findings and recommendations, which was filed in April 2013.
- This Task Force engaged the community in their police services, setting the stage for the Advisory
  Committee on Public Safety.

## **ACOPS History**

- On March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2016, the Paradise Valley Town Council voted to approve Resolution 1330, which created the Advisory Committee on Public Safety.
- On June 25, 2015, the ACOPS group met for the first time.

- Promoting resident participation and engagement.
- Engaging the community on public safety issues.
- Receiving presentations and materials from the Paradise Valley Police Department.
- Advise the Mayor and Council on Committee activities and recommendations.

    - Passive users want information to arrive to them when it affects that user.




- Communication methods of Police Department
