Administration Budget Highlights in 2019

- License Plate Recognition (LPR) program (\$220k).
 - LPR Expansion at Tatum and Lincoln (\$132,500)
 - LPR Electronic Maintenance Agreement (\$60k).
 - LPR at Stanford and 40th Street has been hit by a large vehicle on three occasions (\$27,500).
- Expand surveillance system (\$55,000).
 - Add cameras to high risk facilities
 - Better angles to see inmates when housed in the jail
 - Provide video surveillance to an interview room
 - Expand the parking lot coverage



Administration Budget Highlights in 2017

- SB 1110 prohibits use of "duly authorized agent" to sign PE cites.
 - Request four part time police officers to review and sign photo enforcement citations (\$160k).
- Alarm coordinator position
 - Administrate Paradise Valley alarm monitoring program
 - Assist in enforcement of the False Alarm Ordinance (\$87k including benefits).

Administration Budget Highlights in 2019

- PD System analyst position (\$88k including benefits).
 - Troubleshoot and correct LE software platforms (RMS, CAD, E-Cite, BWC).
 - Train personnel on LE software platforms.
 - Maintain electronic forms Program and troubleshoot ID cards.
 - Administrate hiring process.
- A \$60,000 increase in photo enforcement process server fees.
 - Total administration budget increase of \$514,305.

Communications Budget Highlights in 2019

- Request one full-time dispatcher (\$75k including benefits).
 - Drives personnel costs increase of 24%.
- Supplies and services budget decreases by 17%.
- Total increase of \$66, 299.



Patrol Budget Highlights in 2019

- Body worn camera replacement (\$120k).
 - Paradise Valley provided body worn video cameras in 2014.
 - Beneficial change in technology over the past four years provides new features, ease of data naming, transfer and redaction.
 - Current cameras suffer battery failures and mid-incident stoppages.
- Request vehicle replacement and vehicle equipment (\$212k).
 - Replace two patrol vehicles with new Tahoes (\$40k each).
 - Replace two administrative vehicles (\$32k each).
 - Replace and install of equipment (\$68k total).

Total increase of \$70,419.

Investigations Budget Changes in 2019

- The decrease of \$40,116 (-4%) is driven by reduction of personnel costs (\$34,905).
 - Newer officers are now assigned to investigations, decreasing the total dollars needed to cover the overall benefit package.
