FY 23 Community Services Funding Program

- Investigate agencies or programs addressing those needs
- Working group made up of Town Manager's Office and Police Department

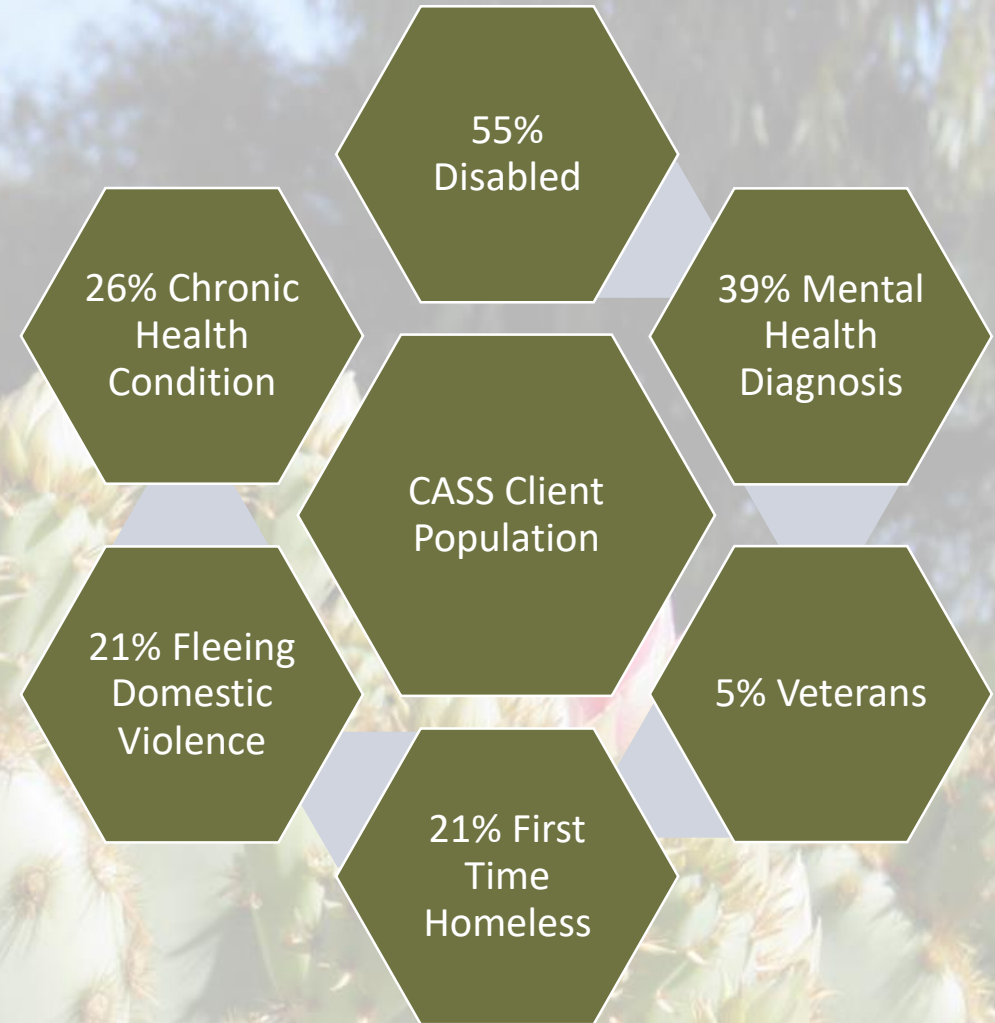
Initiatives Recommended

Regional Homeless Initiatives

Central Arizona Shelter Services (CASS)

- Largest and longest serving homeless shelter in AZ
- Mission is to prevent & end homelessness
- Serves adults and families
- Shelters operate at full capacity 24/7/365
- Case management to assist with employment, benefits, medical care, mental health treatment, dental care, housing and more



Regional Homeless Initiatives

Central Arizona Shelter Services (CASS)

Demand for services increased 30% in
FY22

Increased # of shelter beds
from 470 to 600

Senior Haven w/ 170 beds to
serve needs of seniors

Support Services for Older Residents

Duet: Partners in Health and Aging

- Their mission is to promote health and well-being for homebound adults and family caregivers
- PV residents are currently enrolled in their program



Grocery Shopping

Set up a regular schedule with a matched volunteer to either take you to the grocery store, or get your groceries for you.



Rides to Doctor's Appointments

With 4 business days advanced notification, a volunteer (if available) will drive you to and from a medical or social service appointment.



Friendly Visiting and Friendly Phoning

Enjoy weekly visits and/or phone calls with your matched volunteer to stay connected.



Paperwork Assistance

A volunteer will help you from once or twice a month to sort and/or read mail, handle correspondence, and pay bills.



Minor Handyperson Services

A qualified and trustworthy volunteer is available for minor home and safety repairs. Examples include changing of air filters, light bulbs, smoke detector batteries, and fixing leaky faucets.



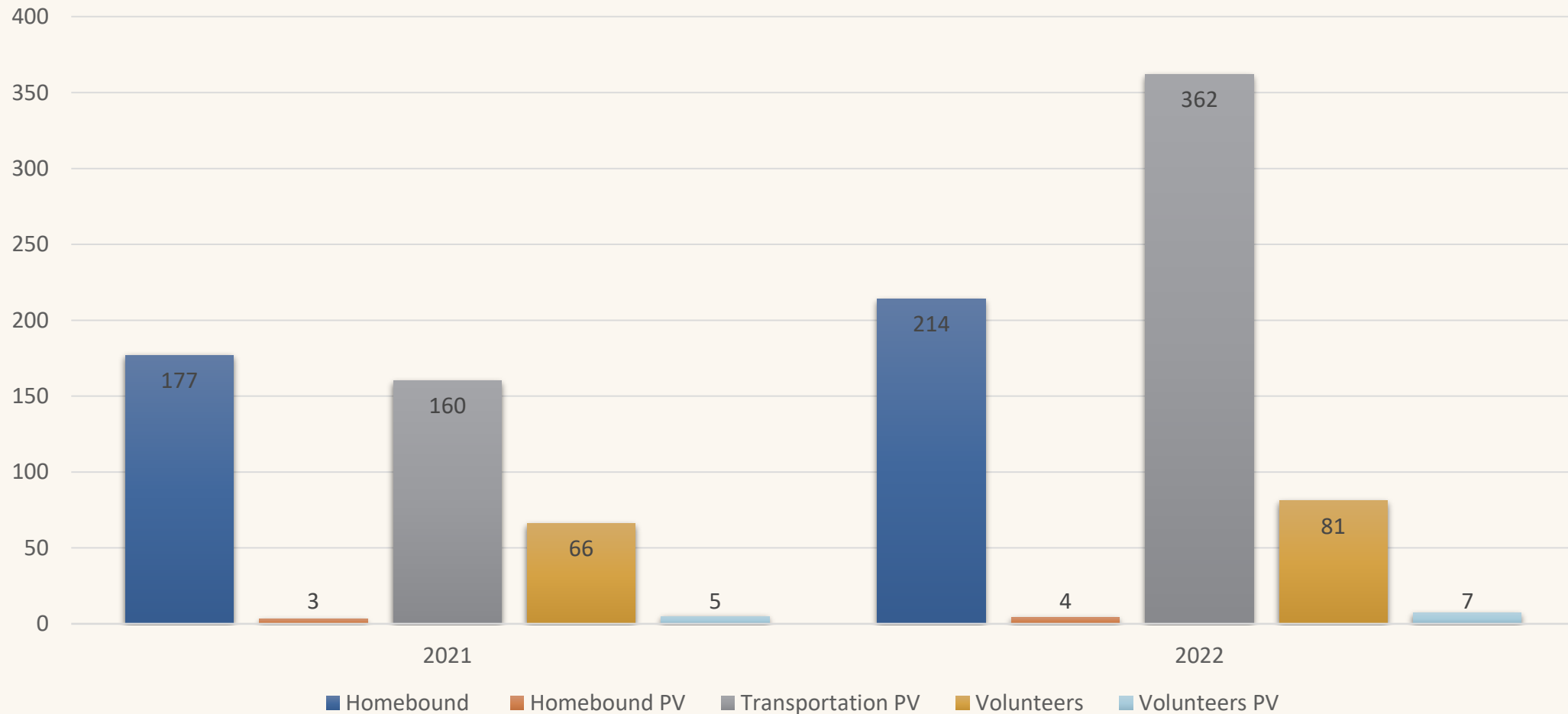
Tech Assistance

Duet: Partners in Health and Aging

In-Home Services



FY 24 MAG Enhanced Shelter Services

- Additional shelters are planned across the county to accommodate 30% increase in demand for services and 7% increase in homeless counts.
- MAG drafted and approved a Regional Homelessness Planning Partnership to reduce and prevent homelessness.
- Cities of Scottsdale and Phoenix currently have active contracts underway to support enhanced shelter and need additional funding.
- PVPD works actively with Scottsdale; Town would be recognized as an active partner in regional efforts to reduce homelessness
- Budgeted amount \$200,000



FY 23 McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park

- Scottsdale Railroad & Mechanical Society funding request for new facility
- Town has partnered with nonprofit before on capital improvements
- Council could authorize a budget transfer of \$50,000 from FY23 unspent funds.



Next Steps

- FY 23 Funding Recommendation
 - CASS: \$55,000
 - Duet: \$10,000
- FY 24 Homelessness Recommendation
 - Scottsdale Shelter Enhancement/MAG: \$200,000
- FY 23 Railroad Park Roundhouse Recommendation
 - Scottsdale Railroad & Mechanical Society \$50,000
- Schedule for Council Action May 25, 2023
