RESOLUTION NUMBER 1192

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PARADISE VALLEY, ARIZONA, DECLARING A REASONABLE AND SAFE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT OF 35 MILES PER HOUR ON A SEVEN HUNDRED (700) FOOT PORTION OF INVERGORDON ROAD IMMEDIATELY NORTH OF ITS INTERSECTION WITH MCDONALD DRIVE IN THE TOWN OF PARADISE VALLEY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, A.R.S. §28-703 authorizes the Town to determine and declare reasonable and safe maximum speed limits for streets within the Town; and

WHEREAS, Section 11-2-1 of the Paradise Valley Town Code authorizes the Town Council to change the speed limit on specified streets by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Number 227 established and declared that a twenty-five (25) mile per hour speed limit was a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit on Invergordon Road within seven hundred (700) feet of the north right-of-way line for McDonald Drive because of the presence of a private school; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Number 472, pursuant to a traffic and engineering study, established and declared that a thirty-five (35) mile per hour speed limit is a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit on Invergordon Road between East Lincoln Drive and Chaparral Road except for that part lying immediately north of the northern right-of-way of McDonald Drive for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet (Resolution 227); and

WHEREAS, the private school located at 6050 North Invergordon Road has permanently closed and thus no longer generates vehicle congestion and juvenile pedestrian traffic.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Paradise Valley that Resolution Number 227 is hereby repealed and superseded. The Mayor and Town Council hereby declare, pursuant to the traffic and engineering study conducted in connection with Resolution Number 472, that thirty-five (35) miles per hour is a reasonable and safe maximum speed limit on that portion of Invergordon Road lying immediately north of the northern right-of-way line of

1 McDonald Drive for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet.

3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the immediate operation of the
4 provisions of this resolution is necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
5 health, and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this resolution shall be
6 in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council of the Town of
7 Paradise Valley, Arizona.
