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1	WHEREAS, this amendment to the Special Use Permit for Lincoln Plaza Medical Center is
2	consistent with the property's designation as "Medical Office" in the Town's General Plan Land
3	Use Map; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the zoning district of "Special Use
6	Permit – Medical Office, Kennels and Veterinary Clinics" shall now be shown on the Town's
7	Zoning Map along with a reference to the new major amendment special use permit reference
8	number on the Town's official Zoning Map of "SUP 18-06"; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, in accordance with Article II, Section 1 and 2, constitution of Arizona, the Town
11	Council has considered the individual property rights and personal liabilities of the residents of
12	the Town before adopting Ordinance #2018-19 (the "Ordinance").
13	
14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL
15	OF THE TOWN OF PARADISE VALLEY, ARIZONA THAT:

17	SECTION I. In General
18	1. The Special Use Permit zoning for Lincoln Plaza Medical Center allows for medical
19	uses on the approximate 2.1 acres of land located at 7125 E Lincoln Drive in the
20	Town of Paradise Valley, Arizona, more particularly described on Exhibit "A,"
21	attached hereto (the "Property").
22	2. This Major Amendment to the Special Use Permit (SUP 18-06) for Lincoln Plaza
23	Medical Center hereby rescinds all prior Special Use Permits for the Property and
24	creates a new Special Use permit to allow for redevelopment of the Property through
25	demolition of all existing structures and the construction of a new two-story medical

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- center with covered parking, subject to the Conditions set forth in Section II of this
   Ordinance.
- 3. To provide historical reference of what is being rescinded a description of prior
  amendments to the Special Use Permit for the Property is summarized in Exhibit "B,"
  attached hereto.
  4. All prior Special Use Permit approvals on this Property are rescinded and no longer in
- 6 4. All prior Special Use Permit approvals on this Property are rescinded and no long
- 7 full force and effect upon the Effective Date of this Ordinance.
- 8 5. This Major Amendment to the Special Use Permit for this Property is in accordance
  - with Section 1102.7 of the Zoning Ordinance.

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SECTION II. <u>Conditions</u>. Pursuant to Article XI of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Paradise Valley, Arizona (the "Town"), the Town hereby grants to Jamel Greenway L.L.C., an Arizona Limited Liability Company, its successors and assigns, Special Use Permit 18-06 by its approval of this Ordinance (the "SUP 18-06") governing the use of the Property. All capitalized terms contained herein shall have the meanings ascribed to them parenthetically or otherwise in this Ordinance.

This amendment is one of many amendments to the first Special Use Permit on the Property approved by the Town in 1974. This Special Use Permit is intended to supersede and replace all prior Special Use Permits for this Property and rescinds all prior Special Use Permits for the Property. This Special Use Permit is being granted by the Town to permit the continued use and operation of the Property for medical office use subject to and in accordance with the

23 stipulations and other provisions set forth herein as shown in Exhibit "C," attached hereto.

26 SECTION III. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of

25		a Eight Reflective value at or less than unity eight percent (30%).
26	3.	Any future solar panels are subject to a separate amendment to this
27		Special Use Permit and are encouraged to be placed as part of the
28		parking canopy structures.

30	4.	All mechanical equipment shall be screened so that it is not visible
31		from adjoining properties not a part of this Special Use Permit and
32		from adjoining public rights-of-way. Mechanical equipment and
33		mechanical equipment screens shall be included in the total height of
34		any structure to which they are attached. If applicable, mechanical
35		screening may provide the necessary noise attenuation for any
36 37		mechanical equipment. All mechanical equipment, along with any screens used for attenuation of noise, shall comply with the allowable
37 38		screens used for attenuation of noise, shall comply with the allowable noise levels defined in the Town's noise ordinance. Noise
38 39		measurement shall include any installed screening or other attenuation

42	5.	Screening of backflow preventers, electric transformers, generators, or
43		other similar equipment (all herein further referred to as "Visually

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Unappealing Improvements") visible from off the Property shall be located so as to minimize its visual impact and screened from public view, all of which must first be approved by the Town Manager prior to approval of construction of any such Visually Unappealing Improvements.

## H. LANDSCAPING

- 1. Landscaping on the Property shall be in substantial compliance with the Approved Plans.
- 2. All landscaping that dies shall be replaced in a reasonable amount of time, be in general compliance with the approved landscape plan of the Approved Plans, and shall use material that is on the Approved Plans, Town's Landscape Guidelines, and/or the Visually Significant Corridors Plan for the Property's character zone.
- 3. The Approved Plans show parking spaces along Lincoln Drive that 18 19 could be converted to landscaped area. The width of the landscape buffer along Lincoln Drive may be increased to make this landscaped 20 area more in compliance to the Special Use Permit guideline of fifty 21 feet (50') without an amendment to the Special Use Permit. An 22 23 updated landscape plan of this area shall be provided to the Town Manager, or designee, for review and approval. A parking 24 study/statement, prepared by a licensed engineer and approved by the 25 Town Engineer, may be required to demonstrate the Property has 26 adequate parking. This provision may also apply should there be a 27 request to convert other parking spaces on the Property to landscaped 28 areas. [Planning Commission may want to modify and/or remove this 29 stipulation dependent upon the recommended landscape buffer by the 30 *Commission. This matter is still unresolved*] 31
- 32 I. LIGHTING
  - 1. All outdoor lighting shall be in compliance the Approved Plans, including the wattage and color of each lighting fixture. In the event the Approved Plans are not clear, such lighting shall meet the Special Use Permit Guidelines, as such may be amended from time to time.
- 2. Lamps, lighting, or illumination devices within an outdoor light fixture 39 shall not be visible from outside the Property. If the Town receives a 40 complaint from an offsite owner that a lamp or lighting or illumination 41 device within an outdoor light fixture is visible from outside the 42 Property, the Town Manager or designee may inspect the Property and 43 44 require the Owner to shield such lighting fixture if the Town Manager determines that the light emitting element is visible from outside the 45 Property. 46

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## **RIGHT-OF-WAY, PARKING & CIRCULATION**

- 1. The Owner shall deed sixty-five feet (65') of right-of-way to the Town; as measured from the centerline of Lincoln Drive adjoining the Property (the "Right-of-Way"). All travel lanes, public sidewalk, and associated public roadway improvements shall be located within this Right-of-Way. *[This stipulation requires discussion and direction]*
- 9 2. No above ground structures shall be placed in the Right-of-Way, 10 except for any approved Town monument and/or Town directional 11 sign(s), utilities, and any other approved structures or uses allowed by 12 this Special Use Permit.
- 143.Shared access to the adjoining properties of the Smoke Tree resort,15Andaz resort, and/or AJs center may be allowable. The Owner shall16demonstrate through a traffic/circulation/parking study, prepared by a17licensed engineer and approved by the Town Engineer, that such18shared access is safe and does not create negative or adverse traffic19impacts. [This stipulation needs discussion. It addresses the ongoing20access discussion that may not be solved by Commission action]
- The minimum parking space size shall be 180 square feet as defined in 22 4. 23 Article II, Definitions, of the Town Zoning Ordinance. However, the Approved Plans identify 9-foot by 18-foot parking spaces with a two-24 foot overhang in the adjoining landscape area (which meets the 180 25 square-foot requirement). Accordingly, this two-foot landscape area 26 shall, in perpetuity, be kept and maintained clear of plant material that 27 28 may restrict the parking of a vehicle within this two-foot landscape area. 29
- 315.The Owner shall construct (or provide payment to the Town in lieu of32actual construction) a 6' wide meandering sidewalk within the right-33of-way area granted to the Town and adjoining the Property. This34sidewalk shall be completed in accordance with Town Standards,35including San Diego buff color, at such time as the Town completes36the construction of Lincoln Drive improvements. [Need to define Town37Standards]

## 38 K. SIGNAGE

1. All signs shall be installed only as shown on the Approved Plans. [As background - signage includes a maximum of one (1) monument sign, one (1) building sign on the north façade facing Lincoln Drive, and three (3) directional signs not substantially visible from off-site that comply with the Special Use Permit Guidelines for Medical Offices. Refer to Pharmacy and Urgent Care Center of this Special Use Permit for additional sign restrictions on these uses]

1 2. The lighting for the signs on the Property shall be placed on a timer to shut off between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., unless 2 otherwise approved by the Town Manager or designee for special 3 events. 4 5 3. Any signage for the Property located within any easement portion of 6 7 the Right-of-Way shall be constructed as a break-away sign, such as by the use of hollow construction in which the cells are not grouted 8 solid. 9 10 11 IV. **APPROVED PLANS** [Will need to update with the final plans/documents] 12 13 The following plans and documents apply to the Property.
