40	Section 2. Pursuit to Section 1-9-2 of the Town Code, any person found guilty of
40	violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and
42	upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,500, or
43	imprisonment not to exceed six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each
44	day that a violation continues shall be a separate offense punishable as described.
45	Pursuant to Section 1-9-3 of the Town Code, a violation of the provisions of this Code or
	i instante e section i se of the round every a storation of the provisions of this code of

- 46 amendments thereto may also constitute a civil offense, and any person who is served
- with a citation charging such violation and who admits or is found responsible for such

Whereas the immediate operation of the provisions of this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council.	
13 14 15 16 17 18	<u>Section 5</u> . In accordance with Article II, Sections 1 and 2, Constitution of Arizona, the Town Council has considered the individual property rights and personal liberties of the residents of the Town before adopting this ordinance.
