KEY QUESTION

 Does the Town Council desire to authorize the Mayor to execute standard Uniform Video Service License Agreements?



BACKGROUND

- In 2018, the Legislature enacted Senate Bill 1140 (the uniform video service license legislation) that requires cities and towns to adopt a standard uniform video service license agreement and application and affidavit by July 1, 2019
- By state statute, cities and towns are required to issue the uniform video service license to video service providers that make application for one



BACKGROUND

 The Town council approved the standard Uniform Video License Agreement, Application form, and Affidavit at its June 13, 2019, meeting



BACKGROUND

- The Town has two entities that inquired about obtaining a Uniform Video Services License agreement
- Cox Communications inquired on December 3, 2019 and Century Link on December 18, 2019
- Both were provided with a copy of the application and affidavit and the form of the Uniform Video Services License approved by the Council on June 13, 2019
- Cox submitted its application and affidavit on January 22,
 2019 and based on the state statutory deadline the Uniform
 Video Services License would need to be approved by March 9,
 2020

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-04

 Approval of Resolution No. 2020-04 will authorize the Mayor to execute the Uniform Video Service License with Cox Communications prior to the March 9, 2020 date, and to execute a Uniform Video Service License with Century Link should it file an application and affidavit and have no changes to the form of the Uniform Video Service License
